DEPUTY PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

TRANSITION TO HIGH SCHOOL

This week's Kindergarten Orientation reminds us of the first transition to big school our year sixes took in 2016 when they began Kindergarten. Starting high school is another significant milestone for year six. Getting ready for year seven is an exciting time full of new experiences, but it can also be worrying and challenging for many young people and often coincides with puberty, adding to feelings of anxiety. These worries are all normal. As part of counting down the weeks of year six, we are also looking at ways to support our students to feel more confident.

Mr Lau has designed a high school transition program that equips students with skills to help them in high school. All year six students will learn about organisation tips, scheduling and reading timetables, planning your week and term, managing and balancing high school work expectations and assignments, mindfulness, and managing friendships. And to coincide with the beginning of our transition program for students next week, I will share resources for parents and carers to help their children transition to high school in 2023.

SELECTIVE HIGH SCHOOL – EOI NOTE

Selective high schools cater for academically gifted students with high potential who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic standard. Selective high schools help these students to learn by grouping them with students of similar ability, and by using specialised teaching methods. If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2024, you need to apply on the internet at: <u>https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7</u>.

Applications open on 18 October 2022 and close on 16 November 2022. You must apply **before** the closing date. You must submit only **ONE** application for each student. An expression of interest and notification via Compass were sent home on the Monday of week 2 and needs to be returned to your child's teacher if you intend to apply for the Selective High School test.

Last week the SRC students participated in a Greening Australian gardening initiative. They planted trees and flowering plants. Please enjoy some of their reports below.

On Tuesday 25 October, the SRC participated in a gardening program. We planted native trees such as a Blueberry Ash, bottle brush and a grevillea. We also planted violets and flowers to attract pollinators into our school. We planted them at the edge of the dry creek bed, behind 4H and the hall and in front of 3T and 2/3B classrooms. Some of the plants are used by Aboriginal people for healing purposes like cuts and bruises. If we continue to plant more trees and shrubs we will help the environment dramatically and climate change won't be as bad.

On Tuesday 25 October the SRC students planted Australian Native shrubs and trees across the school. At the top of the dry creek bed, we planted a bottlebrush, a grevillea and a blueberry ash tree in effort to shade that area of the school. We went behind the hall to plant some shrubs and flowers too. Please ensure your child doesn't go behind the hall to see the plants, unless with a teacher because it's an out of bounds area. We also planted flowers in front of 2L and 2P. The SRC did this for make a greener school, a better habitat for animals and to help reduce the effects of climate change.
