# PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Last Friday the School Executive and I attended a Masterclass, presented by Dr Simon Breakspear and Tom Sherrington regarding Leading Professional Growth Cultures. This day provided an opportunity for the Executive team to reflect upon our actions as school leaders and seek improved practices, particularly around Professional Learning for our teachers. I am looking forward to working with the Executive to implement some of the measures we discussed last Friday.

I am very alarmed at the number of students arriving at school too early in the morning. Our school does not have a teacher on duty until 8:50am. Any students on school grounds before this time are at potential risk as they are unsupervised. For your child's safety I implore you to look at alternate arrangements rather than just dropping your child off early at school. It is not a safe practice to do so.

If your child is unwell, please keep them at home. I have received notice from NSW Health at the end of last week that a rise in COVID-19 transmissions within the community is expected in early December. Parents are required to remain vigilant and complete RAT tests on children if they are displaying any symptoms. I do have a small number of RAT tests that I can share with families if anyone requires them. Please notify the office should you need any, and we will send them home via your child.

I had a word with students at this morning's assembly about school hats. Today is going to be one of the hottest days so far this Spring/Summer period yet a number of students did not wear a hat before school this morning nor had one in their bag to wear during the day. According to the school's Sunsafe policy the requirement is No hat, play in the shade. Students who do not have a hat will remain under the COLA for recess and lunch. This area provides the most consistent shade protection. If a student has lost their hat a new one should be purchased from the uniform shop. It needs to be labelled clearly with the student's name.

Tonight is the Annual General Meeting for the school's P&C. I encourage all parents to attend. The P&C provides a wonderful opportunity to participate in our school. I know that some of the current executive members are standing

down from their positions. I thank them for their hard work and dedication.

Tonight is the last School Council meeting for Carla Liedtke, our current President. Carla has been on the School Council for the past four years. She has been a strong voice for the parent community. I wish to thank her for all she has done for us.


