PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Today we welcomed 70 new Kindergarten students to our school. As they all walked through the gates, some confidently, some with trepidation, they have all begun a journey which will take them 13 years to complete. One of the greatest gifts a child can be given is a solid education and I look forward to supporting both students and their parents as their exciting adventure begins. Our Kindergarten teachers, Miss Scott (Rel. Assistant Principal ES1), Mrs Parr and Miss Rawnsley conducted Best Start assessments with our new Kindergarten students last week. This assessment has provided the teachers with a clear picture of where all our students will be starting from and enabling the teachers to ensure they meet student needs right from the start. The first few days will be spent settling all children in. Kindergarten parents will receive a letter by the end of this week, confirming who will be their child's teacher for the year.

We have several new and returning staff members this year. Firstly, I welcome Mrs April Butler and Miss Caitlin Rawnsley, who were both permanently appointed to our school on the second last day of school last year. I would also like to welcome back Mrs Hollie Burke, who is returning from maternity leave 3 days a week to take 1H. She will be sharing 1H with another new teacher, Mrs Hayley Watts. Miss Lily Hogan has returned to our school for Term 1 only to work with Miss Brittany Roulston, who is completing practicum requirements in Term 1. Miss Roulston will take over 4R fulltime at the beginning of Term 2. I also welcome new teachers Miss Peyton Kelly, who will be teaching 4K, Miss Jessica Tosswill, who will be teaching 5T and Mrs Vanessa White, who will be doing RFF 2 days a week. Considering the challenges of staffing at the moment, I feel very fortunate that we have a fully staffed school, and I look forward to the value that all our new staff will bring to our school.

Returning to our staff also this year is Ms Alicia Cheng, who was successfully appointed to the role of Assistant Principal, Curriculum and Instruction at the end of 2022. The Assistant Principal, Curriculum and Instruction position is a leadership role dedicated to ensuring that literacy and numeracy knowledge and skills are embedded in curriculum and assessment; high quality teaching practices are enhanced; and the capabilities of middle leaders are strengthened in literacy and numeracy instruction. Miss Cheng will be working across all classrooms, K-6 this year, supporting teachers to implement best practice within the classroom. She will also be presenting parent information sessions around literacy and numeracy at the start of this year. Keep an eye out in future newsletters for further information.

Our Years 1-6 students began last Tuesday, and thanks to firm numbers, we were able to form classes on Wednesday. I am so pleased to see students settling into their new classes so guickly. A reminder that all students should be wearing full school uniform. Uniforms give students a sense of belonging and enhance pride in their school. When variances to the uniform begin to creep into the school, it can undermine what has already been established. Whilst it may not seem significant if your child is not wearing the correct school hat, if it continues with a larger number of children not wearing the correct hat, it can affect the 'tone' of the school. The uniform shop is open every Monday morning and Friday afternoon. Any parents who require financial assistance to ensure your child is in correct uniform, please phone the office to make an appointment with me where all conversations will be dealt with sensitively and confidentially.

Information was sent out last week regarding Meet the Teacher meetings on Monday 13 February (NOTE: 6G, will be holding their meeting this Wednesday, 8 February at 5pm in 6G's classroom). I am so pleased to see these presentations return to a face-to-face format and I encourage all parents to take this opportunity to come and meet your child's teacher. During this evening, teachers will try to finalise who will be our class parents for the year. The role of class parent is pivotal in providing parents with a one point of contact for information. Class parents can also help to bring people together and introduce new people to one another. This role can be jointly shared. It is important for all parents to understand, this is a volunteer position and that it is not your only source of information. I ask that any parents interested in the role reach out to your child's class teacher now. There will be class parent meetings occasionally with class parents to ensure everyone is supported.

HEALTH & SAFETY

The health & safety of our students is always of utmost importance to the Boronia Park School community. As such there are systems and rules in place to ensure everyone's safety.

Before school, at recess and at lunch a student must be able to see a teacher and be seen by the teacher when in the playground. Teachers and School Learning Support Officers (SLSOs) wear fluorescent vests so that they can be more easily seen. To ensure that staff can see all the students, the playground play area is to be restricted to visible areas only. This means that some areas are *out of bounds*. These areas are marked, where possible, with double white lines.

Buildings are also out of bounds during breaks. Before school there are 2 staff members on duty, so the play area is reduced in size. The dry creek bed, grass, basketball court and equipment are also *out of bounds* before school so that the 2 teachers can still supervise those that have arrived. At recess and lunch there are three teachers on duty at any one time. During these times these extended areas are now *in bounds* and students can play in them under the safe supervision of the teachers.

Students are expected to remain in the correct areas for their own safety.
