OFFICE REPORT

SCHOOL COMMUNICATION

All communication will be emailed from our new Schoolbytes system to your email address. If you have not yet created an account, please do so as soon as possible. The office can be contacted if you need to be reminded of the How To procedure.

Where notes require parental permission eg Excursions, full details of the activity can be found by parents under the Activities section in the parent portal, where online consent can be given.

The Activities section of the portal will not, however, show details of notes where parental permission is not required, eg details only of our SISA Term 1 program. This information will be received as an attachment to an email message from Schoolbytes and will be your source of reference.

As new features of Schoolbytes are rolled out we will advise parents accordingly.

A reminder that detailed User Guides can be found on each section of the parent portal if needed.

HOW TO ENTER AN ATTENDANCE ON THE SCHOOLBYTES PARENT PORTAL

Parents are now able to enter their child's absence on the Parent Portal providing they have created an account.

Partial absences need NOT be entered by parents. The school office will enter these absences when your child arrives/leaves the school.

Planned absences (for 3 days or more) may be entered via the Parent Portal. However, a completed Application for Extended Leave Travel form will still need to be submitted to the school and relevant itinerary documentation attached where applicable eg. flight details.

Next week we will provide further information on how to complete the Application for Extended Leave -Travel form online.

To enter all other leave eg. sickness, 1-2 days leave or other circumstances, the absence can be recorded in the Portal by:-

Selecting Attendance Under Planned Absence select Create Enter your child's name.

Several options will appear under the *Absence Type*. Please note that whichever reason is selected, this may be overridden by the teacher in line with the Department of Education's policy and procedures for absences.

Schedule Type - A full day/multiples days **only** to be selected (no partial)

If you wish to upload any documents eg. a doctor's certificate, this may be uploaded under *Upload file Comments* - The reason for your child's absence. *Submit*

Bus Safety Week reminds all road users to '
Be Bus Aware

Our school bus operator Busways is reminding all road users, parents, and students to 'be bus aware' as part of Transport for NSW's Bus Safety Week campaign, running 20 – 26 February.

Bus Safety Week, part of the **Be Bus Aware** campaign, sees Governments, bus operators, and emergency services raise awareness about the importance of being safe in and around buses and spread the message to **Be Bus Aware**.

The initiative provides a timely reminder to parents to have a talk with their children about bus safety; to motorists when giving way to buses; to pedestrians to make sure they are alert of their surroundings; and to cyclists to ensure they can see where buses are. We all have a part to play in bus safety.

SCHOOL ZONE



Term 1 - 2023

The beginning of the year is always a good time to develop safe habits for you, your children, and the surrounding community.



Road rules are there for a reason

...and so are our Rangers.

Please treat Council's Parking Rangers with respect as they do their job to patrol school zones and enforce parking rules to help keep our children safe.

ZONE	WHAT DOES IT MEAN?	WHY IS IT THERE?	PENALTY	DEMERIT POINTS*
NO STOPPING	You cannot stop in a NO STOPPING zone for any reason (including queuing or waiting for a space).	Keeps clear sight lines between drivers and children / pedestrians.	\$352	(School Zone)
₽	You can stop in a NO PARKING zone for a max, of two minutes to drop off and plok up passengers. If no spaces are available you cannot quoue on the road way or in any other zones while waiting for a space. You will need to drive away and part elsewhere, only returning when there is space to pull up. You must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle at all times and cannot leave your vehicle unattended.	Provides a safe place for children / pedestrian set down and pick up.	\$196	(School Zone)
BUS ZONE	You must not stop or park in a BUS ZONE for any reason (including queuing or waiting for a space) unless you are driving a bus. If times are shown on the sign, you are not allowed to stop during those times.	Provides a safe place for large buses to set down and pick up school children.	\$352	(School Zone)
	You must not stop on or within 20 metres before a PEDESTRIAN CROSSING or 10 metres after a crossing unless there is a control sign permitting parking.	So drivers can clearly see pedestrians on the crossing.	\$469	(School Zone)
×	DOUBLE PARKING You must not stop on the road adjacent to another vehicle at any time even to drop off or pick up passengers.	Double parking blocks visibility and forces other cars to go around you.	\$352	(School Zone)

Let's talk about the benefits of Active Travel

PHYSICAL

It gets you moving early in the day and again in the afternoon. In a world of high screen usage, physical movement is even more important for general health and wellbeing.

SOCIAL

It gives you the opportunity to spend time with your young child. Older students (age 11 and above) enjoy the opportunity to talk with their friends.

MENTAL

Being physically active can improve concentration, self-esteem and increase independence.

ENVIRONMENTAL

Less cars equals less traffic and congestion around schools which reduces pollution.



At school, your child will learn about road safety as part of Personal Development, Health and Physical Education.

Active Travel with primary school-aged children

- Walk, ride, scoot or skate with your child to and from school. If you do have to
 drive, try parking away from the school and walking with your child for the rest of
 the way.
- At the end of the day meet your child at the school and walk together back to your car, parked away from the school.
- Use this time to talk about their day as well as how to be a safe pedestrian.
- Encourage older children to actively travel to school for the physical, social, mental and environmental benefits (if it's safe to do so).
