PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

School Bytes has only been operating in our school for a very short time, however I would like to thank all families for embracing this new system and working with the school and myself as we iron out some minor issues. It will take a little while before everything is running perfectly, but I am thrilled to date with the functionality of the system. The electronically signed notes have been a major improvement from the school's perspective. It allows us to see very quickly who has responded and who we need to follow up with. 

LETTER FROM THE P&C PRESIDENT

We have an exciting few months ahead with a big line up of social and fundraising events. As always, these events can't happen without the input of volunteers.

Coming up is the Election Day BBQ and Cake Stall, Saturday 25 March. This event is as much about fundraising for the school as it is about giving back to the local community.

We are in need of volunteers - if you have never volunteered on the BBQ before, I can assure it is a lot of fun - it is always my favourite day. You may have seen the message on the school Facebook group about volunteering at the canteen. The canteen is always in need of volunteers, especially Thursdays and Fridays. New parent volunteers need to only fill in the Department of Education *Declaration for Child-related Workers* form and return to the school. It's a quick form to fill in if you are volunteering for the first time. The link to the PDF is on the Facebook group, Boronia Park Public School Community Group. If you

haven't joined the group already, please do sign up as it is an excellent resource for communications.

We have some new, cheaper fees from Flexischools. Currently parents pay a 29c order fee for lunch and recess food orders only. Now, parents are charged 15c on recess orders (down from 29c). The buy-two-for-\$7 sushi deal, available in person at the canteen, should now also be available on Flexischools. Soon, Flexischools will offer a shopping basket for food orders, so multiple food orders can be purchased for one day, streamlining the process for parents. I will update when this is available. Service fees for events will also be down to 2.2% from 2.7% - but this fee is never passed on to parents when ordering tickets for events.

Our next P&C General Meeting will be held on Monday 20 March, 7:00pm start. Please note: We will be changing the start time from 7:30pm to 7:00pm, for all P&C general meetings. All meetings will now run from 7:00pm-8:00pm, in respect of the already-long day teachers (and parents) have had. If you are interested in attending to learn more about the school, or want to get more involved, we hope to see you there.

The P&C will be holding a planning workshop on Monday 1 May, to help devise a 5-year plan for the fundraising targets. All parents are welcome. Please keep an eye out for more details in the coming weeks.
